CAANH participated in the planning of the first Asian American Festival in the Town of North Hempstead. The Manhasset school year beginning in September 2010 was full of fun filled events sponsored by the CAANH.

SCA Fall Luncheon: We kicked off a great start with a donation to the SCA Fall Luncheon Fundraiser with a gift bursting with an assortment of teas in a big basket. Chinese Language Classes: In a pilot program facilitated by Manhasset SEPTA, CAANH sponsored two sessions of free Mandarin classes at the library for elementary students. The response was overwhelming with 35 participants and many more on a waiting list. A decision was made to open up two classes, beginner and advanced, limiting students to 12 per class. We would like to acknowledge Kelly Fu, director of SEPTA's Gifted and Talented program, for her extraordinary efforts to get the Chinese language classes off the ground. Tiger Tales: The CANNH celebrated the Year of the Tiger with a shadow puppet show, *Tiger Tales*, performed by the Chinese Theatre Works at Shelter Rock School. This 40 minute show teaches life lessons and Chinese proverbs through the use of light and handmade puppets, a method of entertainment originating thousands of years ago in China. Their award winning technical director, Stephen Kaplan, is famous for creating the shadow puppets for the *Lion King*. International Day: Held at Munsey Park School, this day was enjoyed by children and teaching staff. The China booth offered ink brushes and paper for writing Chinese characters. There were games, and lucky jade charms were handed out.
